

Surrounded by Water, But...

Keeping an Island from

RUNNING DRY

any Landings residents have lived in a city where the municipality is the water provider. The availability of fresh water is a given. Maybe the city had a reservoir or a large natural source of water like a major river. This is not the case for Skidaway Island.

Skidaway's water source is the Floridan Aquifer, which extends from Florida northward to the base of the Appalachian region near Atlanta and runs eastward to the ocean. The aquifer is a large body of porous rock and sediment that holds groundwater. Water is continually withdrawn from the aquifer through pumps and wells and is recharged through natural rainfall.

The aquifer is at risk, because salt water from the Atlantic Ocean is leaking into it, hundreds of feet below ground level. This intrusion is occurring in the coastal area of Port Royal near Beaufort and for many years has been migrating south to Coastal Geor-

gia. Due to the intrusion, the Georgia Environmental Protection Division (GEPD) has established withdrawal permits for cities, towns, and counties along the coastal area, including Skidaway Island and 41 other communities. Withdrawal permits limit the amount of fresh water to be extracted.

MANAGING SKIDAWAY'S FRESH WATER WITHDRAWAL

Prior to 2010, the water withdrawal permit for Skidaway Island, via Utilities, Inc. of Georgia, was 2.61 million gallons per day (mgd). After 2010, this amount was reduced to 1.695 mgd, a decrease of 35 percent in water availability.

You might think golf course irrigation or maintenance of the Landings Association's (TLA) significant common areas result in the withdrawal of the most water. However, TLA and The Landings Golf and Athletic Club (TLGAC) source water using various shallow



wells outside the purview or constraints of the 1.695-mgd permit. These reductions were established through cooperation and planning among TLA, TLGAC, and Utilities, Inc. of Georgia, the water and wastewater service company on Skidaway Island.

Utilities, Inc. is guided by the 1.695 mgd permit as it works to supply residents and business with water. This withdrawal provides fresh water for approximately 4,600 homes, as well as the South Harbor community, The Marshes of Skidaway, Thrive, and businesses in the Village on Skidaway Island.

Water connections on Skidaway Island increased an average of 10 percent annually since 2010 because of new construction and a growing commercial user base. Although demand for water has increased, Skidaway Island achieved a 10 percent reduction in per capita water use during the period. Such results in managing island growth while conserving groundwater below the Georgia EPD permit level has been an outstanding achievement. It would not have been possible without the culture of environmental sustainability embedded within the Landings community. Skidaway has been certified as a sustainable community since 2018 by Audubon International.


Skidaway has met and exceeded the expectations of GEPD permit withdrawals since 2010. In 2025, the GEPD will explore further permit withdrawal reductions for the island. If this occurs, Skidaway Island will be required to reduce its withdrawal amount by 2030. Given current housing trends, such a reduction will be very challenging, if not unattainable.





Utilities, Inc. of Georgia, TLA, Skidaway Audubon, TLGAC, and the Landings Company have worked together and will continue to collaborate on water conservation and sustainability to lessen the community's impact on the Floridan Aquifer. TLA has agreed that in addition to working with the GEPD, the community should continue to promote and pursue focused efforts in water conservation through a suite of proactive strategies. Moving forward, residents can expect increased communication about groundwater conservation, including managing water loss, smart irrigation technology, water management tools, water conservation tips, and ways residents can become actively engaged in reducing reliance on the aquifer. We all can become more involved in protecting our water assets.





DANIEL DAVIS

aniel Davis is a graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy, a decorated combat veteran of the Marine Corps, an advancing professional, and a solid family man.

A Chicago native, Davis comes from a law enforcement and military family. His father is a retired member of the Chicago Police Department, as was his father before him. Brother James is a member of the Cook County, Illinois, Sheriff's Department. Davis's maternal grandfather is a Korean War combat veteran, and one of his uncles served in Vietnam

When Davis graduated from the Naval Academy in 2002, he chose the Marine Corps and received a commission as a second lieutenant. Nowadays, roughly 25 percent of Midshipmen join the Marines. Davis had known that he wanted to be a Marine from the first day he arrived at Annapolis. The new graduate completed the Marine Corps Basic Course, then the Infantry Officer's Course

Davis says the IOC imbued him with leadership skills that have served him well, from combat-ready roles to civilian life. In short order, Davis's preparation would be put to good use. He was assigned to the 1st Marine Division in Iraq, the first of three deployments to the country, each more dangerous than the previous.

The junior officer was SUICIDE CHARLEY instructed to report to "Suicide Charley" Company, 1st Battalion, 7th Marines Regiment, 1st Marine Division. The story of Suicide Charley begins October 24, 1942,

at a defensive perimeter on Guadalcanal commanded by the legendary Marine commander Lewis "Chesty" Puller. Under attack from hundreds of Japanese soldiers, Charley Company held its ground, but at a high loss rate. The next day, as the remaining Japanese licked their wounds, Charley Company raised a makeshift flag of white parachute cloth bearing the skull and crossbones and

the words "Suicide Charlie." The legend lives to this day, suggesting that it's suicidal to attack Charley Company, as they will defend themselves to the last

During his first deployment, Davis served as a platoon commander for legendary company. At full strength, a Marine infantry platoon is roughly 40 men. The company operated out of Najaf, then Babylon, when Saddam's sons, Uday and Qusay, were killed by coalition forces. Patrols were not without peril. "Fortunately, we only occasionally detonated an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) because the insurgents were just beginning to use them," Davis says.

When his six-month tour ended, Davis reported to Twenty-Nine Palms, California, where he became proficient with various weapons used by Marine combat companies. Promoted to first lieutenant, he returned to Iraq, again as a platoon commander for Suicide Charley, now stationed in Anbar Province, bordering Syria. Often, insurgent forces would attack from across the border and then quickly retreat. Assaults were more frequent than during his previous deployment, and Marines on patrol often had to travel an uncomfortable distance from the relative safety of their base.

Davis's final rotation was almost the same as his previous one – stateside to Twenty-Nine Palms, then back to Iraq. This time as a captain and the executive officer of Suicide Charley. The anti-coalition insurgency was in full swing. "On patrol, we almost always encountered IED explosions and ambushes," Davis recalls. "In spite of the excellent medical care our corpsmen provided, we lost our share





of Marines to battlefield wounds."

When the Marines entered a village, suspected target houses were searched for weapons or high-value insurgent fighters hiding inside. Often the front door of a suspected house had to be breeched by a lead Marine. This task required courage and nerves of steel.

"But it wasn't all combat, all the time" Davis explains. "We, along with attached Seabees, rebuilt lots of Iraqi infrastructure – schools, meeting places...We provided security for our construction workers."

Davis vividly remembers many close calls. But he was fortunate to return home unharmed. He was discharged from active duty on May 23, 2007. The chest of his military dress jacket is barely large enough to hold his rows of awards and medals.

Of course, the Marine Corps wanted to retain its impressive young officer for career service – which Davis appreciated – but he had other plans for himself and his growing family. Recognizing the value of an advanced degree in the business world, he enrolled at the University of Chicago Booth School of Business, where he earned an MBA with concentrations in finance and econometrics and statistics. Combined with his military leadership experience, he was strategically positioned for success in private equity, which was his goal.

Davis is currently a managing director at the Thurston Group, a prominent healthcare-focused private equity firm. He is a devoted husband to wife, Lauren, and father to two growing children, son Connor and daughter Maggie.

Live smart

Wise Weight Loss

Seeing Past Your

The promises sound great. "Flat stomach in 14 days!" "Lose belly fat fast!"

Even if it were healthy and sustainable to lose weight rapidly (it's not), belly fat can't be targeted through exercise. "Your body chooses where it's going to take the fat from first, as well as where it's going to store it," explains Anthony Weakland, ACSM-CEP, a health educator in the Wellness Center at St. Joseph's/Candler.

The type of fat you are accumulating matters. The fat right under your skin, the kind you can pinch, is called subcutaneous fat. Exercises like sit-ups can tighten your abdominal muscles but won't get at the visceral fat wrapped around your abdominal organs. Visceral fat is the culprit behind health problems like high blood pressure and insulin resistance.

"Exercise is very important, but you can't forget about getting a good night's sleep, managing stress, and eating right," Weakland explains. "Nutrition is a huge factor. Good sleep and stress management are also key tools to controlling visceral fat."

Watching your intake of processed foods sugary items like soda can help you decrease your accumulation of visceral fat. "You don't have to stop yourself from eating potato chips altogether, but you could cut out that extra serving," Weakland says. "And maybe add a little distance or speed to a daily walk."

Instead of grinding through an aerobic activity that you feel forced to do, try to find

something you enjoy. "If you don't like running, do something else," Weakland advises. "Swimming, bicycling, or just walking – there are so many ways to stay active."

Strength training should also be part of your fitness routine. "Lifting weights improves your metabolism and can counteract the natural loss of muscle mass that comes with age," Weakland says. "Everybody's story is different, but there are certain factors we

Weakland encourages his clients to take baby steps on their journey - small, positive changes that are sustainable. When these adjustments are linked together, they help you feel better overall. Then, staying healthy doesn't feel like work. Looking at the bigger picture rather than focusing on your belly will, somewhat ironically, be the healthiest way to lose belly fat.

It's one of the body's essential elements and vital to bodily functions. It is the most abundant substance in the body, averaging 60 percent of body

"Water is essential for your metabolism, cell function, temperature regulation, circulatory function, aiding with digestion, and preventing dehydration," says Tori Thomas, dietitian at the Candler Hospital Wellness Center. "Staying hydrated can help decrease fatigue, improve gastrointestinal function, and improve alertness, cognition, and mood."

How much fluid and what kind of fluids you need per day depends on many factors including activity level, sweat loss, body mass, and daily caloric intake. For the general healthy population, if someone is on a 2,000-calorie diet, about eight and a half cups of fluid per day would be a great goal.

"There's not actually a recommended daily amount of water intake, but total fluid intake," Thomas explains. Other fluids can come from foods and drinks you consume

during the day, including coffee, electrolyte drinks, soda, tea, and soups. "However, with total fluid intake, I always recommend it comes from mostly water."

When you don't get enough fluid, your mood can change. You can overheat, especially if you are outside a lot. You can suffer constipation and kidney issues. Signs that you may be dehydrated or not getting enough fluid include:

- Very dry mouth and tongue
- Headaches
- Drv skin
- Dark-colored urine
- Muscle weakness
- Lack of focus

Need extra motivation? Drinking water can help with weight loss and weight man-

"Drinking water isn't going to magically make you lose weight – because that is going to be related to the number of calories you consume – but water consumption can help with weight management, especially when you replace caloric beverages like sweet teas, sodas, and sugary juices, with non-caloric options, such as unsweetened tea, water with lemon, or water by itself," Thomas says.

If you don't think you're getting enough water or want to incorporate more water into your diet, try these tips:

- Set realistic, small goals to achieve throughout the day and then expand upon those goals.
- Buy a nice, new water bottle that you want to regularly use. Carry it with you for easy access
- Water bottles are available with timers on them to help you remember and encourage you to
- Set an alert on your phone or calendar to remind yourself to drink water.
- Add fresh flavors to your water, like citrus, cucumbers, or mint. You can keep a pitcher in your refrigerator and vary flavors.
- Try sparkling or flavored waters but pay attention to added sugar and calories. Moderation is key.
- Drink electrolyte drinks (again in moderation), but try to choose sugar-free or lite-sugar flavors.

The barred owl lives in conferous forests near water sources and wooded swamps. They require dense foliage for daytime roosting and rely on large trees with cavities for nesting, meaning they dependent on old growth forests.

Although sometimes active during the day, they typically hunt at night, preying on small mammals and occassionally birds. Barred owls live alone for most of the year, except during breeding season until the young leave the nest. Mated pairs typically live in adjoining home ranges, with an incresing degree of overlap during breeding season. They will call to other members of the species. Their distinctive call of "Hoo, who cooks for you!" can be heard at night and will often answer even a bad imitation.
